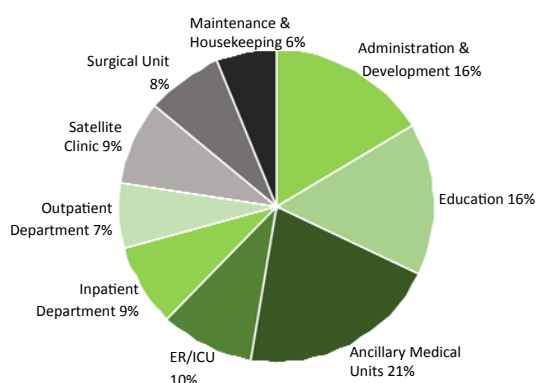

Healing Spinal Tuberculosis

Sopheap, an 11-year old girl, was cycling to school one day when she fell off. Two days after the accident, Sopheap's lower extremities became numb and she was crying in pain. After the local provincial hospital were unable to treat her, Sopheap and her father made the long journey from their home near the Thai border to Siem Reap. A taxi driver brought them directly to Angkor Hospital for Children, where Sopheap was diagnosed with a fractured spine and, after extensive testing, the underlying cause was identified as Pott's Disease, a rare form of TB occurring in the spine that can cause paralysis if left untreated. Sopheap was quickly immobilized in a neck plaster and received TB treatment and pain management in our Inpatient Department for more than 40 days. Sopheap has been referred to the National Paediatric Hospital in Phnom Penh for a spine surgery consultation with a visiting American neurosurgeon. Thanks to our quick diagnosis and provision of financial and food support to her father during their long stay, Sopheap is on the road to recovery.

2016 Budget



Our 2016 budget has been approved by the Board of Directors at \$6.5million, a slight increase from \$6.1million in 2015. An additional \$600,000 for capital costs were also approved. Fundraising and cost-saving efforts enabled us to fulfill our needs for 2015, and we are working hard to do the same for 2016 and beyond.
