Progress and highlights against our strategic goals (2022-2026)



Goal 1: Be a leading secondary and tertiary care centre delivering paediatric specialist services to children from across Cambodia.



Numbers of children seen by the outpatient department have returned to pre-pandemic levels and are averaging around 350 per day.




Waiting times are down by 65 minutes compared to 2019.



The busiest specialist outpatient departments are Respiratory and Neurology, with Dental and Eye numbers remaining stable.



There have increases in the number of children seen as in-patients on the general ward and Paediatric Intensive Care Unit, with bed occupancy at 90-100% showing the significant demand for these life-saving services.



When Roth took a photo of her then seven-month-old son Mesa, she knew something was wrong with his eyes. Recommended to come to AHC for treatment, the family travelled 332km over 20 times for Mesa to receive eight chemotherapy and three eye laser therapy sessions at AHC's Eye Clinic.

Mesa is now cancer free.



While we received treatment for my baby, I was amazed at the quality of care and expertise of AHC's staff. At AHC, every staff takes care of all patients so well. AHC is like heaven to me. We received treatment for free. Patients who needed it even received additional financial support. So I think to myself, I will one day do something to help back AHC.

Goal 2: Build capacity in Cambodia's healthcare system that extends beyond AHC's walls.



The last six months has seen the return of nursing, medical and other healthcare students to AHC for in-person training. AHC's Education Department has welcomed fellows, residents and medical students to learn side-by-side with AHC's paediatric specialty doctors.





Over the past six months, the AHC community team worked in the southern half of the Kra Lanh District, providing health trainings on hygiene as well as training teachers on screening for eye and dental health issues.

Furthermore, AHC has welcomed back international medical volunteers to Siem Reap to add to virtual mentoring and knowledge sharing that developed during the pandemic.

The Saving Babies Lives team completed their work with village volunteers and staff in twenty two rural health centres in Preah Vihear Province in April and unveiled a new Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at Cheam Ksan Referral Hospital.

Goal 3: Run the organisation with exemplary governance.



In April, AHC launched a new Health Information System (HIS). The HIS is a tailor made solution for AHC that allows different departments to integrate more quickly and efficiently, and will in the future integrate information from the government database.




For much of the hospital's history, AHC has relied on funding from international sources. Over the past five years, funds raised in Cambodia have grown significantly and now contribute around one third of the total operating budget.

Despite this progress, significant fundraising challenges remain and AHC is developing opportunities beyond fundraising to generate income to fund our work.

In July, AHC piloted a simple \$5 contribution scheme, accompanied by a communications plan ensuring those who cannot afford to contribute still come to AHC for free treatment. The reaction from the public has been one of support and understanding, with 80% of families contributing to the cost of their care.

This way, wealthier Cambodian families are helping poorer Cambodian families get the care they need for their children.




Financials

Our forecast expenditure is \$4.767m, so we still have c\$750,000 to raise to meet our costs.


Source of Funds

Total funds raised January to September 2022: \$4.01mil.




Use of Funds
