## **Meet AHC's first doctor**

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Dr Sar Vuthy was the first doctor ever hired at AHC in 1999. Today, he's our Chief of Surgery

When I started working at AHC in 1999, we had almost nothing. Cambodia was just exiting decades of war and unrest. As a surgeon, I operated on people who were severely injured from fighting and explosions. I removed eyeballs and amputated limbs. All with very little equipment, facilities or staff to help us.

Today, surgery in Cambodia looks very different. We have the skills and tools we need to treat children with complex injuries. I'm so proud to have opened our Trauma and Critical Care Centre in 2024 to care for more of these children. It gives me great hope for our children's future. And I'm very grateful for your support in making this possible. Thank you.

## A new era in: Trauma and critical care

2024 was all about elevating our specialty care. This year, in order to strengthen the heart of the hospital, we invested in essential equipment to build a Trauma & Critical Care Centre.

To expand our available care, we invested in hiring and training a team of skilled doctors, nurses, anaesthesiologists and other specialised staff to support the centre. We also increased our age limit from 16 to 18 years old to fill a critical gap in adolescents needing care.



To help raise the US\$1.1 million we need for the centre to be fully operational by 2026, we launched two appeals in March and November. Thanks to your support, we raised an incredible US\$117,550 to build this vital centre and start treating so many more children with complex injuries and illnesses.

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#### The countdown to save Lyma's life

When your child is in an accident, there's often a countdown that begins from the moment of injury. Once the clock starts ticking, you only have so much time before it's too late. Before they start dying.

For three-year-old Lyma, the countdown began when she fell into a kettle of boiling water, burning her entire upper body.

Lyma's grandmother Tevy came running when she heard Lyma's screams. Tevy called her parents, who, like many Cambodians, had moved to Phnom Penh to find work.

"I was at work when I got the devastating news about my daughter. My heart sank, and I was overwhelmed with shock and anxiety," recalled Daline, Lyma's mother. "My husband and I rushed to Pursat Province immediately, tears streaming down my face as I feared the worst for my little girl."

Arriving in Pursat, Daline and her husband stayed with Lyma at a nearby health centre. After two days of no improvement, they decided to make the five-hour journey to AHC.

By the time Lyma got here, her time was running out. A lack of proper care meant her burns got infected. She was dangerously dehydrated and had a high fever. She needed surgery, and she needed it badly. But they had to get her fever and infection under control first.

In our intensive care unit, the team gave Lyma medication for her fever and cleaned her wounds every two days. Our nutrition team provided food packages to help Lyma regain her strength for surgery.



"Seeing her pain broke my heart. I felt so helpless," shared Daline. "But thanks to the incredible care and medication, her condition began to improve almost immediately at AHC. She started finding relief and began to feel more at ease."

After a few days, Lyma was finally ready for surgery. Our surgeons gave her a skin graft to replace the skin that had been burned off. Over 30% of Lyma's skin had second degree burns that needed grafting.

"Lyma came to AHC just in time. If she'd continued on without proper treatment, she likely would've been killed by a severe infection or dehydration," explained Dr Prak Farrilend, AHC surgeon. I'm so glad we were able to save her life before her condition got any worse."

Having beaten the clock, our surgeons continued monitoring Lyma for the next week. Seeing that her wounds were clean and healing well, Lyma went home a week later. Our surgeons and physiotherapists will continue following up with her to ensure she heals with no further complications.

"I'm relieved we came to AHC before it was too late," Daline expressed. "The doctors were incredible – they took time to explain everything and provided effective treatment that made a real difference. They didn't let her suffer. There's no place that can care for my daughter like AHC."



## A new era in: Saving Babies Lives

As we continue prioritising local leadership and sustainability over the next few years, many of our programmes are undergoing restructures. One of these restructures has been to our Saving Babies Lives team, who merged with our community team in 2024.

Ms Leng Daly and Ms Kong Naro now lead the programmes, working closely to share their connections and strategies for working in Cambodia's rural communities.

The merging of the two programmes has come with many benefits for both teams. It created one united department conducting outreach work for AHC, enabling a greater sharing of skills and resources. This has improved the efficiency of both teams, giving them more time to focus on their life-saving work for children and families in Cambodia.





#### A new project location

In August, our Saving Babies Lives and community teams started new projects in Angkor Chum Health Operational District, Siem Reap Province.

Before launching the new projects, the teams conducted a full-day theory of change workshop to reflect on and evaluate the last six years while planning for the next phase of the programme. After the workshop, the teams felt confident and ready to take their learnings from Preah Vihear into Angkor Chum.











#### Panha's miracle baby

Panha was only 30 weeks pregnant when she suddenly developed severe stomach pain. She knew something was wrong. But as a single mother struggling financially as a farmer, Panha worried about the cost of treatment. She decided to take a three-hour taxi ride to Siem Reap, where she knew she could find free care.

But midway through her journey, Panha started giving birth. Her driver dropped her off at the nearest clinic, where her son Chan was born. He weighed only 1.6 kilograms and was in critical condition. "My baby was so small and pale, and his cry sounded so weak. I felt so hopeless. I didn't care about anything except getting him to a hospital that could help him," Panha remembered.

Unequipped to treat him, the clinic transferred Chan to AHC. Here, our neonatal team immediately placed him in an incubator and gave him a feeding tube. Over the next month, Panha and the neonatal team never left Chan's side. Meanwhile, our medical social work team provided Panha with food, breastfeeding education and financial support. After a month in the hospital, Chan was finally strong enough to go home.

"I feel so lucky to have come to AHC," Panha shared. "The medical staff are so skillful, and because of them Chan is now healthy. AHC made a miracle for my baby, and for me too."

As our Saving Babies Lives team works to strengthen rural clinics with essential knowledge and resources, our neonatal team continues to ensure newborns like Chan get the care they need — wherever they live and whatever their ability to pay.

As part of our long-term funding strategy, we set up an endowment fund in late 2024. Our target is to raise US\$5 million by December 2026, thus enabling AHC to carry out its strategic vision even during unforeseen challenges. By providing continuity and income security, this endowment fund safeguards the financial future of our organisation.
