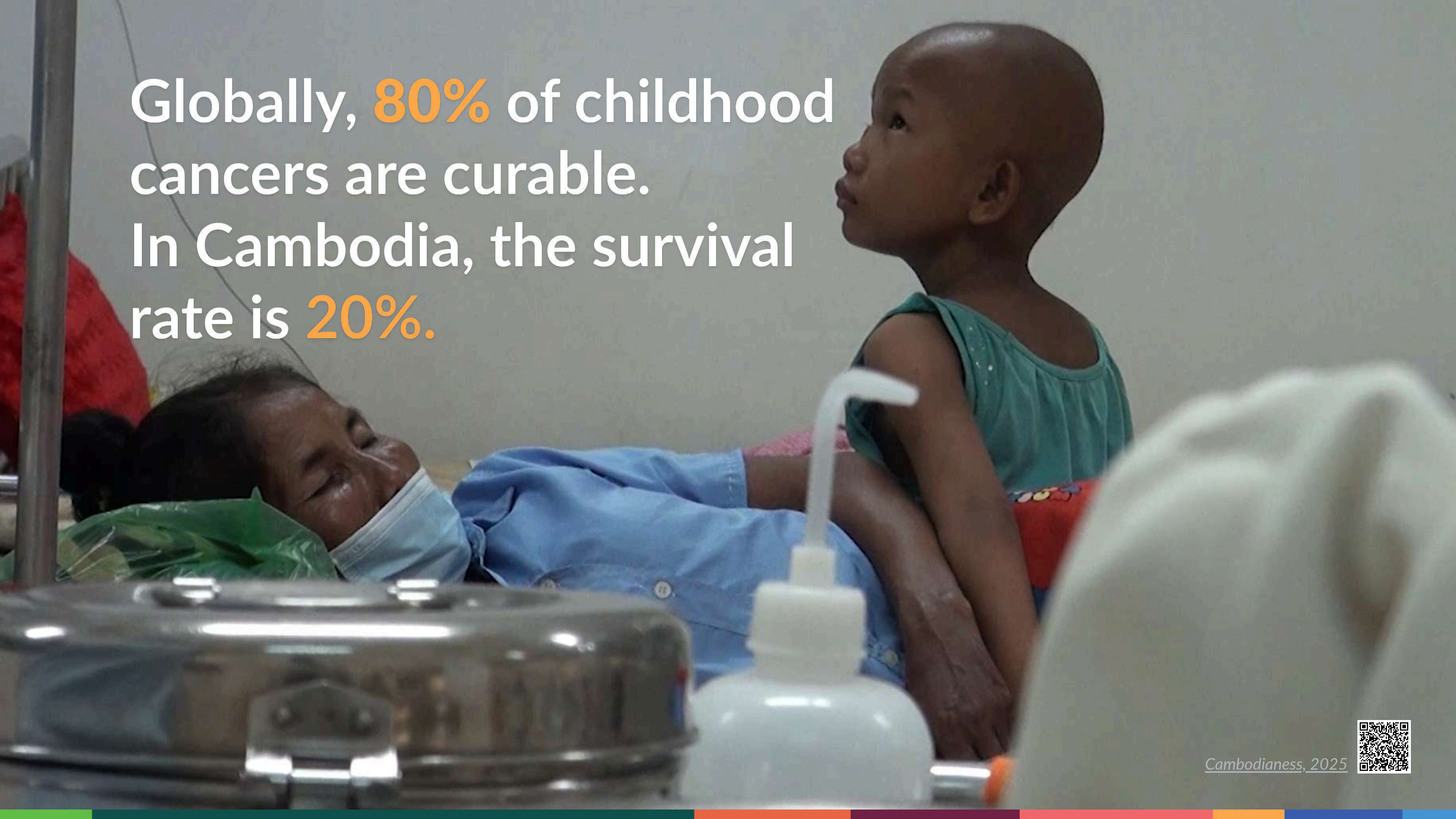

In Cambodia, the survival
rate is **20%**.



It is a hidden crisis.

Without timely diagnosis and treatment, many children lose their lives to cancers that are curable.
For families already struggling to survive, cancer care is devastating—emotionally and financially.

In 2012, we opened an Oncology Unit and began treating retinoblastoma, an eye cancer in children.



In 2020, we created a dedicated oncology ward.



Today, we care for more than 30 types of paediatric cancer and specialise in eye and blood cancer.

More than medical care

Medical social work

We care for children and families with emotional counselling, travel stipends, food packages, and education on care, treatment, and side effects.

Nutrition support

Cancer patients receive special meals tailored to their needs. Parents also get constant nutritional counselling, education about their child's condition, treatment plan, and treatment side effects and how to care for their child at home.

To support children requiring long-term cancer treatment, AHC plans to introduce **on-site homestay facilities**, allowing families from distant provinces to stay close during care. This will reduce travel burdens and improve treatment outcomes.

We also plan to create a **library and play space** in the cancer ward to provide emotional support and comfort for young patients during their stay.

Behind the care is our paediatric cancer heroes

Through mentorship from international partners and funding from people like you, we have built an unparalleled Cambodian team of childhood cancer specialists.



Beyond treatment



Our dedicated teams have provided over 26 years of trusted care for nearly 3 million children. One of the few hospitals in Cambodia equipped to deliver comprehensive paediatric cancer care—entirely free.



AHC is the only place in Cambodia that treats eye cancer for free to children.



Our oncologist, Dr Bun Sereyleak, is a member of the National Cancer Control Plan (NCCP) Committee, representing AHC alongside five other institutions.



A new treatment protocol for acute lymphoblastic leukaemia (ALL) is fully implemented. While a formal protocol was established in 2023 for acute myeloid leukaemia (AML).



AHC partnered with international oncology healthcare for support and mentorship.

Our work has only been possible thanks to dedicated international volunteers from around the world. Their time and expertise have been fundamental to cancer care at AHC, and they continue to mentor our staff to this day.

Lina's journey to cancer recovery

Lina was a playful two-year-old when her mother, Bosba, noticed strange bruises and swelling. As Lina's fever worsened, they went from clinic to clinic—but no one had answers.


When they finally arrived at AHC, our doctors quickly diagnosed Lina with **B-cell acute lymphoblastic leukemia**, a form of blood cancer.

"I was terrified," Bosba said. "I thought cancer treatment wasn't possible in Cambodia—and certainly not affordable."

AHC's social work team stepped in with financial support, and our oncology team began Lina's chemotherapy right away. After three months, **Lina's fevers are gone, the bruises have disappeared, and she's responding well to treatment.**

"I wish I had come to AHC sooner," Bosba shared. "They not only saved my daughter but supported me every step of the way. I'm truly grateful."

It costs around **US\$490,000** to keep our cancer ward running annually. These are life-saving services. We must keep raising critical funds to ensure no child is left without care.

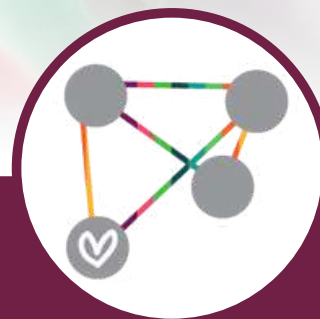
