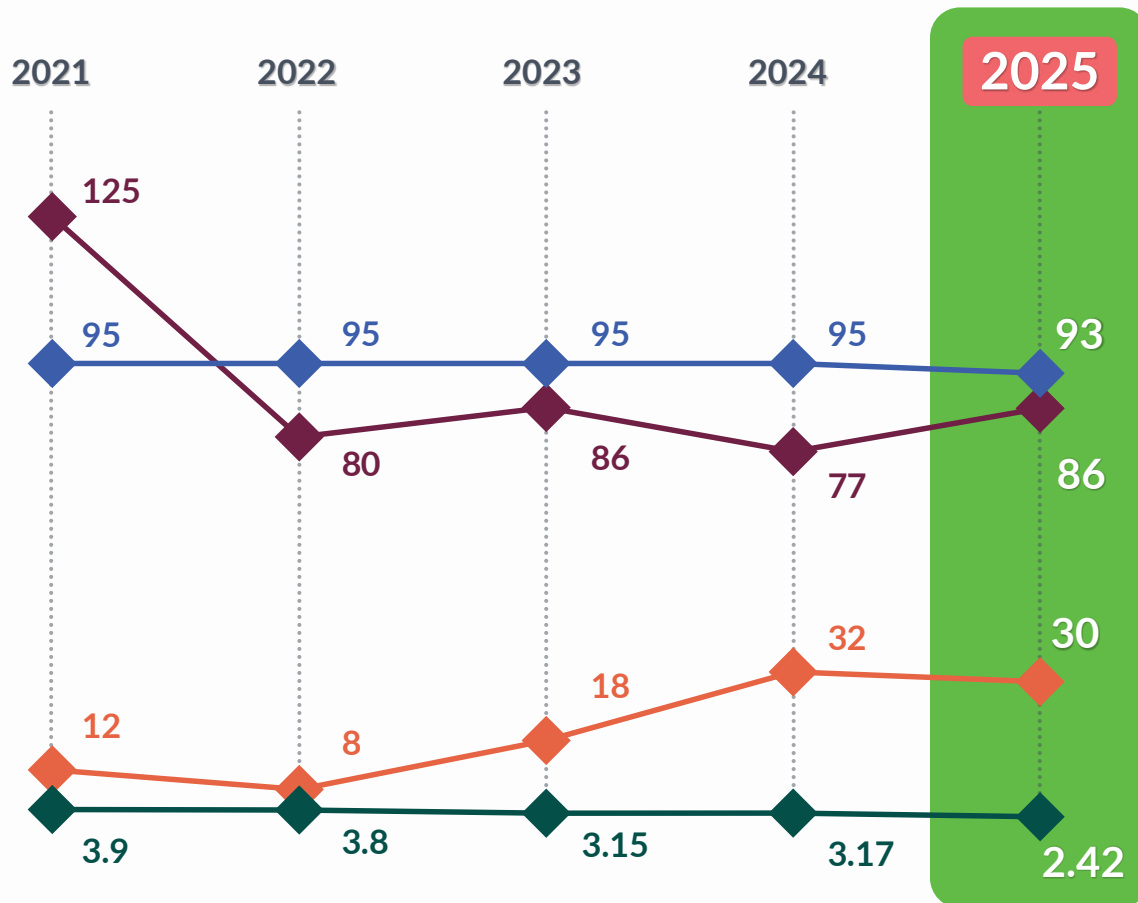

The performance data from 2021 through 2025 demonstrates AHC’s continuous commitment to creating a safer, healthier, and more efficient environment for every child that walks through our gates.



A crowning achievement in child safety is the steady decline in healthcare-associated infection rates, which dropped from 3.9% down to a record low of 2.42% in 2025. By preventing these infections, the hospital directly shields vulnerable children from secondary illnesses during their recovery.



Thanks to a strong commitment from you, AHC continues to improve and strengthen our belief of a high-quality and compassionate healthcare for every child in Cambodia.

Roof restoration



Through the support of our long-term partner, **YP Foundation**, we were able to complete roof restoration works for the physiotherapy and medical social work unit, as well as part of the eye clinic building, in mid-November 2025.

Although a relatively simple infrastructure improvement, the impact on the children and families we care for has been significant. It has eliminated persistent roof leakage, creating a safer, cleaner, and more comfortable environment for patients and caregivers.

The project also included reorganising and securing electrical wiring, as well as installing additional lighting and fans to improve ventilation and comfort for families while they wait for treatment and consultations.

More importantly, many families travel from rural provinces, and staying near the hospital during their child's treatment is often not financially viable. With the improved roof and upgraded space, families are now able to set up temporary sleeping areas more safely, allowing them to remain close to their children throughout treatment.



New dental chair

The dental unit remained one of our busiest departments, helping to eliminate children's pain and suffering and bring healthy smiles to between **800 and 1,000 patients each month**. With such a high patient volume, reliable equipment is critical to ensuring children receive timely, safe, and effective treatment.

Thanks to **Katherine and Peter Meiklejohn**, who not only volunteered in our dental clinic in the community but also kindly donated a new dental chair, helping further strengthen our dental services.

“The new chair is a very welcome addition to our clinic. The equipment is fast, reliable, and much easier to work with in our daily practice. Our old chair served us for many years, but it often broke down, which disrupted work and delayed patient treatment. The new chair has made a real difference to both staff efficiency and patient experience,” said Dr Bou Naren, Chief of dental clinic.

This donation highlights the important role that volunteers and individuals who share our values play in strengthening paediatric healthcare services in Cambodia.



More than a cooking space

Completed at the end of May 2025, the kitchen renovation has transformed our old kitchen into a modern facility with separate cooking and storage areas. This upgraded space has enabled our nutrition team to work in a cleaner, more hygienic, and better-organised environment, improving both efficiency and compliance with patient care standards.

In addition to providing patient nutrition and meal support to families, the nutrition team now also conducts cooking demonstrations, helping caregivers better understand nutritional support for their children's recovery and learn how to prepare appropriate meals during treatment and after returning home.

Furthermore, a dedicated kitchen space for patients' families has also been established, allowing them to prepare and cook their own meals. This has helped many families reduce daily expenses while their children receive treatment at the hospital.

This important renovation was made possible thanks to the generous support of the **Herbalife Family Foundation**, our longstanding partner and major supporter of the nutrition programme.



New bronchoscope & spirometer

One of the first patients to benefit from our brand-new bronchoscope

When Darin was admitted to AHC with acute gastroenteritis (GE) and severe dehydration, doctors noticed that he continued to experience fatigue and breathing difficulties, although he showed no signs of respiratory distress on admission. Concerned by these symptoms, they decided to investigate further with a chest X-ray.

The results surprised everyone. The X-ray revealed a foreign object, a screw, lodged in his airway. Once the cause of his condition was identified, doctors quickly arranged a procedure to remove it.

"If the screw had remained there for several more months, it could have caused scarring and recurrent infections. Using our flexible bronchoscope, which can reach areas of the lower airway that a rigid bronchoscope cannot, we were able to remove the foreign body after more than three hours," said Dr Kong Sokchinda, Chief of respiratory unit.

One of the main challenges of this operation was that one of Darin's lungs was not functioning properly due to the blockage. Furthermore, granulation tissue had also developed around the screw, making removal more difficult and increasing the risk of bleeding. Without the bronchoscope, the procedure would have been significantly more difficult.

Mobile library

We understand that patient care takes more than medical treatment, and as such, we launched our mobile library programme as part of our holistic care in December 2025, which has quickly become a source of comfort and joy for many children and their families across the hospital wards.

More than just a recreational activity, the mobile library helps create a child-friendly environment that supports the emotional well-being of patients and caregivers during what can often be a stressful time.

Supported by the YP Foundation and DJ Nana through our social work unit, the mobile library brings books, toys, fairy tales, colouring books, and smiles to every ward.

Border conflict resilience



From July to December 2025, border clashes between Cambodia and Thailand displaced more than **400,000 people across the country**, with Siem Reap Province receiving a significant number of displaced families from the three border provinces of Preah Vihear, Oddar Meanchey, and Banteay Meanchey. Many among those affected were elderly people and children.

With the support of our community, we were able to quickly mobilise to assist those most in need. Throughout this period, our teams worked directly at displacement sites across Siem Reap province, providing health consultations, basic treatment, and transportation support for emergency cases.

Through two week-long relief efforts in August and December, our community team, alongside volunteer nurses and doctors, delivered **2,978 health consultations and check-ups**, and reached **5,955 people through group health education sessions**.

While our reach was limited by the scale of the crisis, these efforts helped ensure that the families we supported—particularly vulnerable children and older people—were able to access essential healthcare and health information during their most difficult moments.

Life-saving care during border crisis



Seyha and his family at Char Chhuk Pagoda (roughly 50 kilometers from Siem Reap town).

Seyha and his family fled their village in Banteay Meanchey Province to seek refuge at Char Chhuk Pagoda, a temporary shelter in Siem Reap. Living with asthma, Seyha soon began struggling to breathe amid the difficult conditions of displacement.

When our medical team arrived during a relief mission, they quickly assessed his condition and provided a nebuliser treatment, helping to ease his breathing and bringing much-needed relief to his family.

"We left as fast as we could—we didn't even have time to bring his nebuliser. When the medical team came, I felt hope. At least my child could be treated properly," said Seyha's mother.



SBL: Expanding reach



Building on the momentum of its successful implementation in Preah Vihear Province, the Saving Babies' Lives (SBL) programme entered a new phase in 2025 with its expansion into Angkor Chum Operational District (OD), reaching some of the most rural communities across three districts in Siem Reap Province.

During its first year of implementation, the programme team installed life-saving equipment for babies in **4 health centres** and **1 referral hospital**, and provided training and mentorship to **425 attendants** from **11 government health facilities**.

As the project continues to expand towards full coverage of the planned 23 health centres and 2 referral hospitals, the team remains committed to ensuring local healthcare workers are equipped with the knowledge and tools needed to give every newborn the chance to survive and thrive.

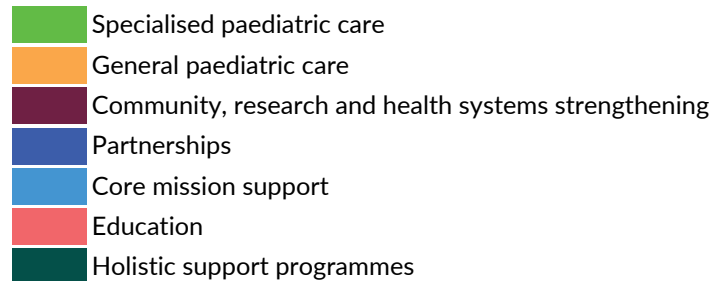
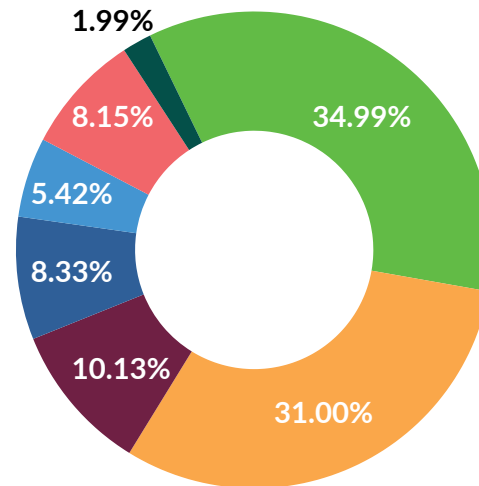
Source of funds

In 2025, we raised US\$5.3 million to support vital healthcare services for children across Cambodia. While our operating income has shown a declining trend over the past three years, our funding remained resilient, drawn from a diverse mix. In addition, we successfully secured approximately US\$3 million in donations for our **Endowment Fund**, strengthening the organisation's long-term financial health and bringing the total fund to **US\$5.1 million** by year-end.

Our overall expenditure remained stable over the past three years, reflecting a steadfast commitment to maintaining essential services despite external funding fluctuations. In 2025, nearly two-thirds of all spending was directed toward specialised and general paediatric care, ensuring children continued to receive high-quality medical treatment regardless of their family's ability to pay.

The remaining resources funded community health programmes, medical education, research, and health system strengthening initiatives. Because 2025 expenditures ultimately exceeded operating income, we prudently utilised a portion of our operating reserves to guarantee uninterrupted care and meet growing healthcare needs.
